November, 2009 – REGIONAL FEW DIVERSITY REPORT

From: Carol A. Dawson, Regional Diversity Chair, Southeast Region

Foreword (musing of an EEO Advocate): I am seeing a strange and unsettling increase in sexual harassment charges through my business. I am attempting to ascertain why this trend may be taking place, but can only speculate at this time. I fear some of this may be a fear from non-minority males (those who have been the abusers in all the cases I have been involved in) losing control. I have been studying the alpha instinct in animals and believe people have much of the same needs and reactions. If an individual or a group of individuals are in need of control and they begin to see they may be losing that control, they may act out and take action they believe is needed to gain it back. It almost appears to be an instinct – absolutely a misguided and illegal pattern of behavior – but nonetheless, instinct. This makes it even more important that the government continues with annual EEO and Harassment training for all employees to ensure the obligations of all employees to be RESPECTful of one another is prominent on everyone’s minds. If it becomes impressed on their minds, there may be less of a chance that the harassment will exist.

- Diversity articles continue to be written for the Regional Newsletter. The intent is to write at least one article for each newsletter.
- FEW members have been invited to send activities relating to Diversity to be included in the Regional Newsletter. I have received no responses
- Diversity training is available for RTPs and other FEW regional training opportunities. I understand there is no budget for travel and thus to provide training would mean the cost would be out of pocket for the Regional Diversity Chair (in my case it would be in addition to the time I would not be working at my business), therefore it continues to be cost prohibitive. Recommend next

year, the Regional Diversity Chair be provided the funds to at least travel to the Regional Training Program (if the individual is a trainer and wishes to take the opportunity). **Recommendation:** The FEW member serving as Diversity Chair for the Region is automatically invited to be a Diversity trainer for the RTPs during her tenure. The budget should include funding to ensure travel and per diem would be available.

News from the FEW National Office: FEW: A HELPING HAND

In conjunction with the 2010 National Training Program (NTP) hosted in New Orleans, Louisiana, Federally Employed Women is reaching out to give back with a yearlong initiative to adopt two- schools in the New Orleans, Louisiana area and provide needy children with resources they so greatly need such as books, supplies, and uniforms.

We know that Hurricane Katrina destroyed many of the schools in the 9th ward and other areas of the city as well. Mary Bethune Elementary Literature/Technology is a public school that serves grades PK-6 in the Orleans Parish School District and its mission is to develop lifelong learners by providing rigorous and relevant learning experiences through literature, math and technology.

Space Coast Chapter - October 2009: The Chapter's October 13th Program Meeting featured Mary Kirkland, a certified athletic trainer and Supervisor from ReHab Works, Kennedy Space Center. Ms. Kirkland educated us on "trigger points" which are defined as hyperirritable spots in skeletal muscle that are associated with hypersensitive palpable nodules in a taut band. She showed us how to apply deep manual pressure to these myofascial trigger points having a dramatic effect in quickly eliminating the pain. Her presentation and handouts also covered nutrition, stress, diet and exercise. And, after her presentation, we feasted on the restaurant's barbeque pork and chicken buffet!

Here's the schedule we have planned:

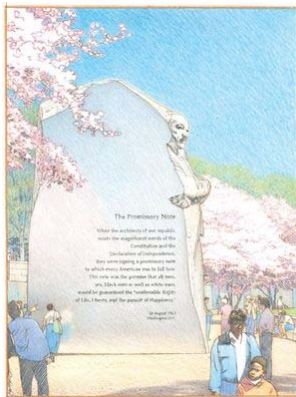
- **Monday, 3:30 EST:** Carol Browner, Assistant to the President for Energy and Climate, discusses the President's push to create the new clean energy economy.

As the Latino population grows to one in four Americans in 2030, it is critical that we are prepared to be leaders in all sectors of society."

CHCI Launches 2010 Calendar, Sponsorship Options

November 12, 2009- CHCI released its 2010 calendar and officially launched its 2010 programs and events sponsorship opportunities. The new year will feature programmatic enhancements with the ongoing national roll-out of Ready to Lead, the expansion of the internship program, and additional CHCI networking and outreach events.

CHCI is recruiting Hispanic American students - undergraduate and graduate - for its nationally recognized leadership development programs. Applications for CHCI's 2010 Congressional Internship, Public Policy Fellowship, Graduate & Young Professional Fellowship, and Scholarship Programs are now available online at <http://www.chci.org/>. The Congressional Internship Program provides college students with Congressional work placements on Capitol Hill to learn first-hand about our nation's legislative process. The Congressional Internship Program application deadlines are: Summer 2010: February 5, 2010 and Fall 2010 semester: April 30, 2010

CHCI's Graduate & Young Professional Fellowship Program offers unparalleled exposure to experience in the underserved public policy areas of health, housing, international affairs and law.

CHCI is also aggressively moving to provide opportunities for young Latinos who are interested in the science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) fields. Recently, CHCI announced its partnership with the Latino STEM Consortium to ensure that Latino youth will have opportunities to pursue internships, fellowships, and even a career working in the STEM industry in Washington, DC.

The fellowship is open to applicants with a graduate degree from an accredited educational institution or equivalent three years professional experience in a chosen policy field. This competitive program is comprised of a nine-month fellowship including a substantive work placement at a legislative subcommittee office, federal agency, national non-profit advocacy organization, or corporate office. The International Affairs Fellowship includes three months abroad in Mexico from February to April. Travel, health insurance and \$2,700 monthly stipend are provided. The Graduate & Young Professional Fellowship Program application deadline is February 19, 2010.

With more than \$1 million in need-based scholarships awarded to Hispanic students since 2001, CHCI's Scholarship Program is available to undergraduate and graduate students enrolled in a two-four year accredited college or university. Students pursuing an associate's degree may apply for a grant in the amount of \$1,000; \$2,500 for bachelors candidates; \$5,000 for graduate students. The Scholarship Program application deadline is April 16, 2010.

To be eligible, all program applicants must be U.S. citizens or legal permanent residents, be a graduate or undergraduate student with remarkable leadership potential, and have demonstrated a vast history and commitment to community and public service.

You Can Help the Next Generation Become a Success Story. CHCI's online application system continues to prove that there is a tremendous need for financial resources and professional development opportunities for the Latino community. Over the past two program cycles, CHCI has received nearly 20,000 unique applications for CHCI student programs.
