

Thanks to our FEW NTP [Planning] Committee and the volunteers who dedicated their time to the putting on the best training conference ever.





#### **LEGISLATIVE PROGRAM DESCRIPTION**

Theme: "Leveling Up for Success: Ready, Set Grow! Envision A New Level."

FEW's Legislative Program is dynamic at the national, state, and local levels. Our legislative agenda works in concert with our mission of representing federally employed women's concerns and interests before legislative and judicial bodies. The Legislative Program is one that is both pro-active and defensive in monitoring urgent Congressional proposals in order to assess the impact on women. FEW accomplishes our mission by establishing close communication with the current Administration and Members of Congress to promote the needs and concerns of women in the federal service.

FEW has developed a strong network at the national, regional, and chapter levels of the organization to encourage active participation in the legislative process. FEW joins forces with other organizations within the women's civil rights, labor, and professional communities with similar goals and objectives to strengthen its lobbying efforts. Additionally, FEW's Board of Directors adopts a national legislative agenda that coincide with each two-year Congressional session. Designed to be the guiding force behind the organization's public policy activities, the agenda is basically divided into a three-tier structure.

**Tier I** issues are considered of utmost importance to female federal workers today and include downsizing of civilian and military personnel, equal employment opportunity, family member care, retirement, and issues affecting women in the military.

**Tier II** issues have an impact on all federal employees, regardless of gender and include compensation, employee benefits, Hatch Act reform, the National Performance Review, and safety and health.

**Tier III** issues affect women as a class and include economic empowerment, health care, and violence against women. The Equal Rights Amendment and voter education and registration activities are given Overall Priority status as they permeate each and every issue above.

### Emily Martin, Vice President for Education & Workplace Justice



Emily Martin is Vice President for Education & Workplace Justice at the National Women's Law Center (NWLC). She oversees NWLC's advocacy, policy, and education efforts to ensure fair treatment and equal opportunity for women and girls at work and at school and to forward policy frameworks that allow them to achieve and succeed, with a particular focus on the obstacles that confront women and girls of color and women in low-wage jobs. This includes the work of the TIME'S UP Legal Defense Fund, which connects those who have experienced workplace sex harassment with attorneys and provides financial support for litigation and storytelling in select workplace sex harassment matters.

Prior to joining NWLC, Emily served as Deputy Director of the Women's Rights Project at the American Civil Liberties Union, where she spearheaded litigation, policy, and public education initiatives to advance the rights of women and girls, especially low-income women and women of color. She also served as a law clerk for Senior Judge Wilfred Feinberg of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit and Judge T.S. Ellis, III, of the Eastern District of Virginia; as Vice President and President of the Fair Housing Justice Center in New York City; and previously worked for NWLC as a recipient of the Georgetown Women's Law and Public Policy Fellowship. Ms. Martin is a graduate of the University of Virginia and Yale Law School.



#### 54 YEARS OF TRAINING

Training has been a major objective of FEW since its inception. In 1970 FEW was aware that federally employed women needed quality training for their career development, so they sponsored their first annual training conference in Washington, DC. The conference consisted of a keynote address by Kentucky Senator Marlowe Cook and four training sessions. From this beginning, FEW's annual training program has grown over the past 53 years and continues to focus on providing exemplary professional development and career advancement opportunities. #### FEW MEMBERSHIP

The membership of FEW shall consist of chapters whose members have subscribed to the mission of FEW, paid FEW dues and, in the case of chapters having been granted a charter, continue to function in compliance with the conditions set forth for Membership in the National FEW Bylaws.

#### **Annual Membership**

Members with annual memberships in chapters of good standing are referred to as Annual Members. All Annual members are required to pay dues annually. Members may renew dues online or by mail. Dues are \$45.00 annually, which includes National and Chapter dues.

#### **Members are encouraged to:**

- Attend meetings and participate in chapter activities
- Become familiar with FEW's goals and objectives
- Become familiar with FEW's Legislative Agenda
- Meet with legislators to educate them on FEW positions
- Keep abreast of issues affecting women and Federal employees
- Respond to action alerts by communicating with legislators
- Register and vote in local, state, and national elections
- Participate in program training in the areas of compliance, diversity and legislation

A Lifetime Membership may be granted to any person eligible for membership who pays the applicable lifetime membership fee as specified in Article III, Section 5 of FEW's National Bylaws. Lifetime Membership is a one-time payment of \$300.00. Lifetime Membership does not preclude payment of yearly Chapter/Regional obligations. Lifetime Members will receive a permanent membership card specifying holder is a lifetime member, a letter of acknowledgment signed by the National President, a personalized plaque showing Lifetime Member- ship, separate Virtual Leadership Summit registration, three (3) days early VIRTUAL LEADER- SHIP SUMMIT registration, and separate entrance to Virtual Leadership Summit events.

A Diamond Membership is an available upgrade to Lifetime Membership and is also available to Annual Members who meet Lifetime Requirements. Members will receive a special place at the preregistration desk at the Virtual Leadership Summit, reserved seating at Virtual Leadership Summit special events, an invitation to the president's reception (first year only), recognition in the Virtual Leadership Summit Program Book, a small gift bag at the Virtual Leadership Summit, one week early Virtual Leadership Summit registration, entrance to Virtual Leadership Summit special events with the NBOD, and name tags similar to the NBOD.

Diamond Membership is a one-time payment of \$500, or \$200 if upgrading from a Lifetime Membership.
